Proof of Residency, Rabies Vaccination and Dog License Required!

- Spaying your female helps prevent uterine infections and breast cancer which is fatal in about 50 percent of dogs.
- Besides averting unwanted litters, neutering your male companion helps prevent testicular cancer.
- No mess! A spayed female won't go into heat, and a neutered male is less likely to mark his territory.
- A neutered male dog won't roam from home in his efforts to find a mate. This makes it less likely that he will become lost, contract a disease, get in a fight, suffer injury, or become a victim to dog fighting, cruelty, poison, or traffic.
- Your neutered male may be much better behaved. Many aggression and destruction problems can be avoided.
- Spaying and neutering helps thwart pet overpopulation and reduces the needless killing of healthy shelter animals.
