

A Safety Message From the Town of Huntington in Partnership With Your local Fire Departments and Ambulance Squads.




Storms and hurricanes can strike quickly and without warning. It can force you to evacuate your home or be confined to your home. What would you do if basic services, such as water, gas, electricity, or telephones were cut off? Every household should consider assembling a “GO KIT”, a collections of important papers and personal items that you may need in the event of an evacuation. The items should be stored in a sturdy, easy to carry container such as a roll-a-way piece of luggage, backpack or duffle bag. Families can cope with emergencies by preparing in advance and working together as a team. Knowing what to do to safeguard you, your family and property is your best protection and the responsibility of every member of your family.

- Copies of important documents in plastic bag (insurance cards, birth certificates, marriage certificates, deeds, photo ID, social security cards, tax and other vital info.)
- Extra set of house and car keys
- Credit/ATM cards and adequate cash for your emergency needs
- Bottled water and non-perishable food items such as energy bars, granola and trail mix
- An alternate cooking source. Store a barbecue, charcoal, starter fluid and matches in case utilities are out of service. Remember; do not use these methods of cooking within a confined area.
- Flashlight, battery operated AM/FM radio and extra batteries
- Sturdy, comfortable shoes, 2 days of clothing and rain gear
- Sleeping bags, extra blankets and pillows
- Medications for at least one week. Maintain a list of all medications for each member of your household, the dosages and copies of the prescriptions along with the doctor’s name and contact information
- First Aid Kit
- Fire Extinguisher
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Paper plates, cups, plastic utensils and a can opener
- Pet Care Supplies and extra water for your pet
- Toys, books, games and activities for children
- Infant formula, jarred baby food and diapers
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
