The Town of Huntington wants to ensure that all of our residents can enjoy everything the Town has to offer.

A few things to note about our Town:

#### **Snow Removal**

The Office of the Highway Superintendent will remove the mound of snow from your driveway within the right of way caused by snow plows if:

- •you are a person with a disability;
- •you meet the income eligibility criteria; and
- •you do not have an able-bodied person with whom you reside to remove the berm caused by the plow trucks.

This program requires annual registration. To apply, please call Janet Serrao in the Office of Disability Services at (631) 351-3068.

### **Handicap/Disability Parking**

People with handicapped/disability parking permits can always park for free\* at metered spaces within Huntington Village all year long, as long as the vehicle has handicap license plates or displays a valid handicap parking permit. \*Metered parking in Huntington Village will be free for everyone through the holiday season, permit or no permit!

There is never a fee for parking in one of the six spaces in the parking lot in front of the Huntington Train Station dedicated for handicap parking, as long as the vehicle has handicap license plates or displays a valid handicap parking permit.

However, parking in a handicap space in one of the parking garages requires both a handicap permit and a resident parking permit, which costs \$75, and parking in the non-handicap 12-hour metered spaces at the train station carries no discount.

Smyth The goal is to make sure that parking is not an impediment to persons with disabilities taking advantage of all that Huntington has to offer, including the many restaurants, shops and entertainment choices in our downtown centers such as Huntington Village.

You should also know that Huntington takes seriously its responsibility to vigorously enforce handicap parking violations, including parking in handicap spaces without a permit and parking in transfer zones – those additions to handicap spaces that make it easier for persons with disabilities to get in and out of their vehicles. Town public safety officers are helped in this effort by trained volunteers. If you know anyone who would like to be a volunteer, have them contact the Handicapped Parking Enforcement Division at (631) 351-2839.

#### Parks & Recreation

The Town recently completed construction of the Harborfields Community Playground, a new, fully inclusive playground for children of all physical abilities on the school property behind the Harborfields Public Library in Greenlawn. The playground is a joint project between the Town of Huntington and the Harborfields School District.

The playground offers children between two and twelve years of age a diverse array of equipment, including slides, play panels, swings, and climbers. Special inclusive elements include a cushioned rubberized surface, accessible swings, double-wide wheelchair ramps, a feature specifically designed for children with sensory sensitivities, a rocking element that can accommodate both wheelchairs and seated children, and a new accessible walkway that connects the playground to nearby streets. An official ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held as the weather gets warmer but the playground is open now!

As for our other parks, Crab Meadow Beach and Hobart Beach both have ADA-compliant playgrounds.

For children with disabilities, there is the boundless playground at Veterans Park in East Northport, which provides fun for children of all ability levels. The Town has a swing for disabled children at Heckscher and Veterans Parks.

Three Town parks – Caledonia, Elwood and William E. Kessler – have handicap accessible picnic areas, as does the bocce court at Elwood Park. All comfort stations at Town parks are handicap accessible.

With the winter season ahead, I hope you will get out and enjoy Huntington, dining at our restaurants, shopping in our stores or experiencing everything our parks have to offer.

### **Town of Huntington Snow Berm**



The Office of the Highway Superintendent will remove the mound of snow from your driveway within the right of way caused by the plows if you are a person with a disability, meet the income eligibility criteria and you do not have an able-bodied person with whom you reside to remove the berm caused by the plow trucks.

**This program requires annual re-registration.** Starting in September, applications for the next winter storm season may be submitted. ### Town of Huntington's Programs for Developmentally Disabled

### **Adult Programs**:

Through the Department of Park and Recreation there is a physical education program on Tuesdays and a general recreation program on Saturdays. Saturday's activities include arts and crafts, films, gym games, music, table games, group discussions, dancing, bowling, parties, trips to sporting events, restaurants and the theatre.

### **Teen and Young Adult Program:**

General recreation program for young teens with developmental disabilities, including autism. The program activities include arts and crafts, films, gym games, music, table games, bowling, parties, trips to sporting events, restaurants, and the theater. This program is supported by a grant from the New York State Office of People with Developmental Disabilities.

### **Social Program Without Walls:**

This program is for independent adults with developmental disabilities, ages 21 and older, who are interested in making friends and socializing with their peers. Participants visit local restaurants, recreation establishments, i.e., bowling centers and movies or go to concerts, sporting events and museums both locally as well as in Nassau County and in New York City. Public transportation is utilized for certain trips. Participants are expected to assist in selecting and organizing activities. Transportation is not provided.

### Did you know?

- The American with Disability Act (ADA) celebrated 28 years in July!
- There are Handicap Swings found at Hecksher Park, Breezy Park, and Veterans Park. Veterans Park located in East Northport on Bellerose Avenue, features ground-level play, adaptive swings, and ramped play structures that allow children to run or wheel through.
- Nassau has passed a bill that would provide ID place cards for deaf motorists. Drivers in Nassau county could carry cards identifying themselves as deaf or hearing-impaired to avert communication failures with law enforcement officers during traffic stops. This new bill directs the Nassau County Police Department to publish "visor cards" that hearing-impaired drivers will keep in their cars and that will be available through DMVs and first responders. The proposal follows calls nationwide for changes in how law enforcement officers are trained to communicate with the deaf or hard-of-hearing.

- The HART bus will be providing transportation to Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center as a 3 month trial, starting in December.
- Good Samaritan Hospital Medical Center in West Islip to open a cancer center at the hospital by mid-2019. The 25,000 square foot cancer center will feature 12 physician offices, 20 exam rooms and a 22-bay infusion center.
- The Federal Government is giving free phones to people with hearing impairments. This phone is a caption phone where the live phone conversation shows up in easy to read text on a large screen. The phone works like a regular phone dial and answer call as usual as well as speak and listen using the phone headset like always. The Social Security Administration offers a Ticket to Work Program. This Program connects one with free employment services to help one; decide if working is right for you, prepare for work, find a job or maintain success while you are working. Anyone age 18 to 64 who receives Social Security Disability Insurance and/or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is eligible to participate in this program. Participation is voluntary and free. Services available through this program include career counseling, vocational rehabilitation and job placement and training. ### Disability Parking Enforcement Program Needs Volunteers



The Disability Parking Enforcement Program needs volunteers to enforce disability parking and fire zone violations in the Town of Huntington. You will receive an hour-long training and will be issued a digital camera upon completion of training. You will receive a \$5.00 stipend per conviction.

### **DISABILITY PARKING**



New York State Department of Motor Vehicles parking permits for persons with disabilities, permanent or temporary in nature that affect mobility, are issued to Town residents through the Town Clerk's Office. An application (either downloaded from the Town's website or obtained from Jo-Ann Raia, Town Clerk, 100 Main Street, Room 102, Huntington, New York 11743) must be completed by the applicant and the applicant's physician.

\*Remember to place your disability tag somewhere where it is visible. If you are not able to hang it on the rearview mirror, place it on the dashboard or your visor (remember to put the visor down).

### **Hecksher Park Program Viewing**

Hecksher Park has a designated location for persons with disabilities to view programs by the stage. This area is designated for all persons with disabilities whether they are visible or not. Persons with service pets are welcomed.





### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

Local public transportation is available Monday through Saturday. The Town of Huntington's HART system (631) 427-8287 and Suffolk County Transit (631) 852-5200 operate a network of regularly scheduled bus routes that serve many of the places seniors might want to travel, including the Senior Center. Buses are handicap accessible. Senior citizens, individuals with disabilities, and Medicare cardholders are eligible to pay reduced fares.

Minibus service is also provided, at somewhat higher fares to persons who are prevented from using the regular buses because of a disability. This paratransit service is operated on a shared-ride, advance-request, curb-to-curb basis by HART (for rides entirely within the Town of Huntington) and Suffolk County's SCAT program (for rides within Suffolk but not entirely within the Town). Both agencies require prior enrollment by application. Personal travel assistance is limited. HART also extends paratransit service, with reduced priority, to non-disabled senior citizen residents who do not drive and do not have access to regular buses. Paratransit is not offered as a more convenient alternative to regularly scheduled buses. For information, call HART at (631) 427-8287 (TTY: 800-662-1220) and SCAT at (631) 853-8337 (TTY: 853-5658). ## RESIDENTIAL REPAIR

The Residential Repair Program **provides minor household repairs** to seniors who reside in the Town of Huntington and are at least 60 years of age. The service is available to homeowners, as well as renters whose living spaces need repair not covered by their landlords. Priority is given to those elderly who are frail, low income, minority, and handicapped to help them live independently in their homes. Residents are responsible for paying for parts and supplies only. There is no charge for labor.

The Residential Repair Program provides minor repairs and installations (no major construction), such as:

- Replacing window panes, fuses, door locks, window catches
- Minor plumbing repairs, for example, faucet or washer replacement, toilet leaks
- Installing handrails, safety rails, grab bars
- Installing/removing window air conditioners
- Patching walls and ceilings (NO major construction or painting)
- Installing and repairing screens/storm windows
- Caulking windows and installing weather stripping around doors
- Repairing furniture, installing shades and curtain rods, tacking down rugs
- Minor repairs to home exteriors, including minor masonry
- Electronics assistance (computer, answering machine, DVD player, etc.)
- Installing smoke alarms and changing batteries

Contributions made to this program are voluntary and confidential. Any donation you wish to make will be used to expand the program and would be greatly appreciated. Services rendered are independent of any contributions. If sending a donation, please make checks payable to: Town of Huntington, and in memo write: Residential Repair.
