What must I do to Comply?

- <u>Type III MSD's</u>: Boat operators must secure each Type III MSD in a manner which prevents discharge of sewage. Acceptable methods of securing a Type III MSD include -
- Closing each valve leading to an overboard discharge and removing the handle;
- Padlocking each valve leading to an overboard discharge in the closed position; or
- Using a non-releasable wire-tie to secure each valve leading to an overboard discharge in the closed position.
- Type I and II MSD's: Boat operators must secure each Type I or II MSD in a manner which prevents discharge of treated or untreated sewage. Acceptable methods of securing a Type I or II MSD include –
- Closing the seacock and removing the handle;
- Padlocking the seacock in the closed position;
- Using a non-releasable wire-tie to secure the seacock in the closed position; or
- Locking the door to the space enclosing the toilets with a padlock or door handle key lock.
- Use pump-out facilities and/or services that are available.
- Regularly examine your on-board sanitary waste equipment for leaks, improper fittings and proper venting.
- If your boat does not have an MSD installed, keep a portable toilet available on board.
 Dispose of accumulated sanitary waste in a proper manner.

NDZ Enforcement:

NDZ regulations are enforceable by any agent with authority over marine resources, including, but not limited to, NYSDEC Environmental Conservation Officers, Town and Village Bay Constables and County Police Officers assigned to patrol the waters of New York State.

Marine Sanitary Waste No Discharge Zones (NDZ's) and Pump-Out Facilities

What is a No Discharge Zone (NDZ)?

A No Discharge Zone (NDZ) is a designated area where the overboard discharge of treated or untreated sanitary waste (i.e., sewage) is prohibited. In 2000, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) designated the Greater Huntington-Northport Bay Complex as an NDZ. In 2011, NYSDEC designated Long Island Sound as an NDZ. In an NDZ, boat operators are required to secure their Marine Sanitation Devices (MSD's) in a manner which prevents discharge of sewage.* This means that vessels with either through-hull waste disposal systems (Types I and II MSD's) or holding tanks (Type III MSD's) must use an approved pump-out facility within an NDZ.

* - Required under Federal Law - 33 CFR 159.7

Why were NDZ's created?

Sewage discharged from boats degrades water by introducing micro-organisms, quality nutrients, and chemical products into the marine environment. Micro-organisms, which include pathogens and bacteria, may introduce diseases like hepatitis, typhoid fever and gastroenteritis to people in contact with the water, and can contaminate shellfish beds. Nutrients, particularly nitrogen, cause algal blooms that are harmful to fish, shellfish, and eelgrass beds. Chemical (i.e., formaldehydebased) odor-control products deliberately added to sanitary waste is toxic to marine life. Pumping sanitary waste out of your boat using designated pump-out facilities helps keep the environment clean, resulting in healthy bays, harbors, estuaries, and ocean waters.
